GRADING SCALE

All grades are recorded as letter grades on the transcript. Grade Point Averages are recorded on a weighted 4.3 scale. Points are earned for each class completed and given a letter value based on the following scale:

GRADE POINT AVERAGE CALCULATION

A student's grade point average is calculated based upon semester grades in all courses from the beginning of ninth grade. Semester grades for Honors courses are given an extra GPA weight of 0.5 and Pre-Advanced Placement courses are given an extra GPA weight of 0.75. Semester grades for Advanced Placement and Dual Credit courses are given an extra GPA weight of 1.0. The extra weight is reflected in the student's GPA calculation.

CLASS RANK

Class Rank is determined by the GPA and taken from all of the student's grades earned at San Antonio Christian High School in grades 9 – 12. Advanced Placement (AP), Dual Credit (DC), Pre-Advanced Placement (PAP), and Honors (H) courses are weighted. Individual class rank is used to determine the Valedictorian and Salutatorian. San Antonio Christian High School is a limited-ranking school and only reports class rank for students in the top ten percent of their class. There are 76 students in the class of 2017.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT RESULTS

In May 2016, 52 students took 74 AP exams covering 8 subjects. Sixty-five percent of the exams received a score of 3 or higher. There were 5 AP Scholars, 1 AP Scholar with Honors, and 2 AP Scholars with Distinction.
